
Our goal with this presentation is to help parents of rising 6th grade students...

WHY TEAMING OUR STUDENTS IS SO IMPORTANT:

- ★ Teaming addresses the unique physical, emotional, social, and academic needs of adolescents.
- ★ Teaming gives your child a gradual increase in independence, which means they have greater freedom BUT ALSO greater responsibility.
- ★ We help your child explore new interests academics, friends, clubs, sports, and so much more.
- ★ We are the bridge:
 - Middle schoolers are growing and changing so fast...
 - o In just 3 short years, it will be time to send them to high school!



TEAMS!


A SMALLER SCHOOL WITHIN THE LARGER SCHOOL

- ★ Each year we have a school-wide theme and team teachers choose their names based on that theme.
- ★ Each team consists of your child's 4 core content teachers (Language Arts, Math, History, Science).
- ★ Teams are instructional and developmental to
 - provide a sense of belonging
 - involve knowledge of the whole student
- ★ Team classrooms are located in clusters.
- ★ Teams provide an identity and social structure for students for team points & competitions, Flex activities, intramurals, team socials, field trips, etc.









- \star Grades 6, 7, and 8
- ★ Approximately 300 students in each grade
- ★ 3 teams of teachers per grade level
- ★ A days / B days with 4 blocks each
- ★ Approximately 85 minutes for instruction each block
- ★ Senior Teacher (grade level administrator) and Counselor at each grade

FACTS ABOUT THE A/B DAY CALENDAR CALENDAR


- ★ A/B days are set in advance.
- ★ The entire county uses the same calendar.
- ★ The A/B day calendar is "set in stone". It will not change even in the event of a missed day due to inclement weather.



FLEX:

STANDS FOR FLEXIBLE SCHEDULE!

- ★ Flex Defined: A <u>structured environment</u> that supports academic success, wellness, goal-setting, character education, and building a welcoming environment for students.
- ★ Each day your student will have a Flex period, much like "homeroom".
- ★ Flex is approximately 35 minutes after 3rd block each afternoon.
- * Flex teachers are team teachers or an elective/PE teacher assigned to that team.
- ★ What Flex IS: Supervised Study Hall, SSR (Silent Sustained Reading), Remediation, Make-Up Work, Test Corrections, SEL/Character Lessons, Clubs, Going to the Library
- ★ What Flex IS NOT: It is not free/social time nor a time to play on cell phones or Chromebooks.
- ★ Students should have something productive to work on whether it's homework, studying for a quiz or test, making up work, getting help from a teacher, organizing their binders, practicing math facts, or silent reading.




WHAT HOMEWORK LOOKS LIKE IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

- * Yes, we give homework!
- ★ Homework is practice and is assigned by most core content teachers.
- ★ Access Schoology for all classwork and homework assignments.
- ★ But what does homework mean with block scheduling?

Students should do homework the night it is assigned!

Ex. Math and Language Arts meet every day, so their homework is often checked the next day; Science and History meet every other day so homework in those classes will be due their next block.

PARENT PORTAL & REGISTERING FOR CLASSES


- ★ Preliminary course requests for the 2023-2024 school year can be selected from December 1, 2022 January 2, 2023, using the Parent Portal in PowerSchool.
- ★ The Parent Portal gives students and families the option to self-select courses for the 2023-2024 school year. After the Parent Portal closes, school counselors will meet with students to review/add requests.



- ★ You can check what your student has requested by logging into PowerSchool on a computer, not the app, and clicking the Class Registration button on the left hand side.
- * Course Verification Forms will come out twice in the spring; first, on March 17 and then again on May 15.

DEVICES AT BELL CREEK MIDDLE SCHOOL




Chromebooks

- ★ Students will be re-issued a device at the start of the school year.
- ★ Safety first! The iBoss filter functions while at school and at home.
- ★ Students should bring it everyday!
- ★ Charge the device nightly.
- ★ Leave their charger at home.
- ★ Power off the device daily.
- ★ Don't place anything heavy on the lid as it will damage it.

Cell Phones

- Historically, cell phones are the #1 distraction to student learning.
- ★ With Chromebooks, students can access educational materials, so cell phones are not needed.
- Cell phones should be silenced and put away during instructional time.
- ★ Cell phones are allowed before 8:45 a.m., during lunch, and after 3:45 p.m.



HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD NAVIGATE MIDDLE SCHOOL





- ★ Be involved and ask questions.
- ★ Get an Agenda Planner/Calendar for your child and encourage him/her to write down their homework daily.
- ★ Check with your child frequently about their Agenda, Schoology, and PowerSchool.
- ★ Establish Homework Patterns:
 - Designate a specific time and place to complete homework.
- ★ Meet your child's friends.
- ★ Encourage participation in extracurricular activities.
- ★ Schedule a team meeting to keep up with your child's progress.

- ★ Email is the best mode of communication with teachers & staff.
- ★ You can schedule a parent conference during team meeting time at any point in the school year.
 - Sign up for our BCMS Email Connect for important updates and our weekly emails.

Schoology

- You can check
 announcements, class
 assignments, homework
 and upcoming
 assessments/projects.
 We ask teachers to update ★
- their Schoology sites WEEKLY.
- Some teachers have students complete their homework on Schoology. Some also provide notes,
- enrichment activities and links to related sites.

PowerSchool

- You can check your child's grades and attendance. Be sure to use the Parent Portal and not your child's login.
 We ask teachers to
- update grades WEEKLY.

 PowerSchool for a few
 days.
